We hope you are safe and well.

We are delighted to announce that registration is now open for an international PhD course on *Landscape, Architecture and Gender*, which will take place from 21-23 October and 9-13 November 2020 at the University of Copenhagen's Section for Landscape Architecture and Planning.

We welcome PhD students from different disciplines and backgrounds, from design schools as well as from cultural or urban studies, geography or other related disciplines – as well as students for whom gender issues have not been a main concern in their research until now.

The course is co-convened by Svava Riesto and Henriette Steiner from the University of Copenhagen. Heidi Kajita (University of Copenhagen/Newcastle University), Barbara Penner (The Bartlett School of Architecture), Meike Schalk (KTH School of Architecture), and Despina Stratigakos (University at Buffalo) will join us to co-teach the course.

The course is structured as a series of dialogical workshops, shared learning formats and mentoring sessions, which will be tailored to the needs of the student group. It corresponds to 5 ECTS credit points.

We will meet twice: on 21-23 October 2020 (module 1) and on 9-13 November 2020 (module 2) at the University of Copenhagen's Frederiksberg Campus on Rolighedsvej 23, DK-1958 Frederiksberg C. If we are unable to convene in person (or if some of us are unable to travel to Copenhagen) due to the COVID-19 situation, we will adapt the course to online teaching platforms and, if needed, adjust the course fee accordingly.

- A 500-word research statement outlining how your research pairs with the course theme.

We will select the participant group and confirm participation by the end of August.
